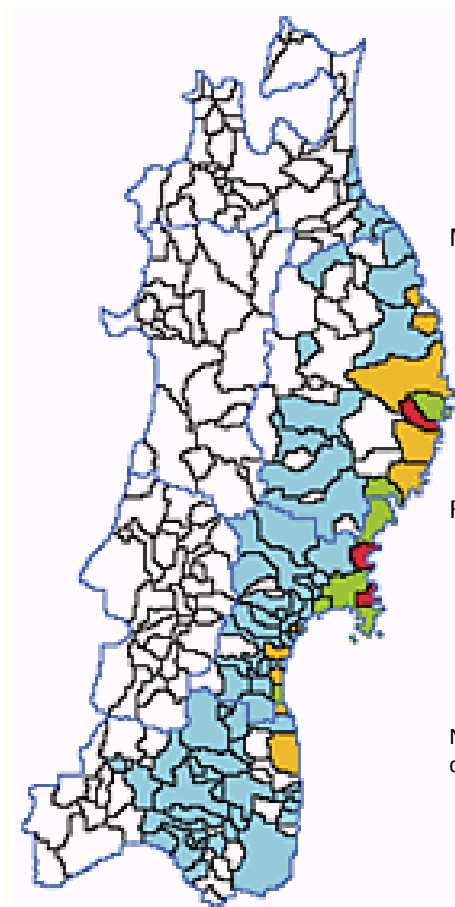


Damage on Housing (by Municipalities) in the Great East Japan Earthquake



- Note: 1 As of August 11. Regarding municipalities where the total number of houses was unspecified by the Housing and Land Survey 2008, the ratio of households is calculated from the National Census 2010.
- 2 The number of houses in Ofunato City is calculated based on the number of those included as “totally collapsed and half collapsed”, and also the number of houses in Otsuchi Town is calculated based on the number of houses included as “totally collapsed, half collapsed, and partially destroyed”

Ratio of totally collapsed houses

- 50% or above
- 30% or above
- 10% or above
- less than 10%

Note: White municipalities have not tallied the number or have no fully destroyed housing facilities
