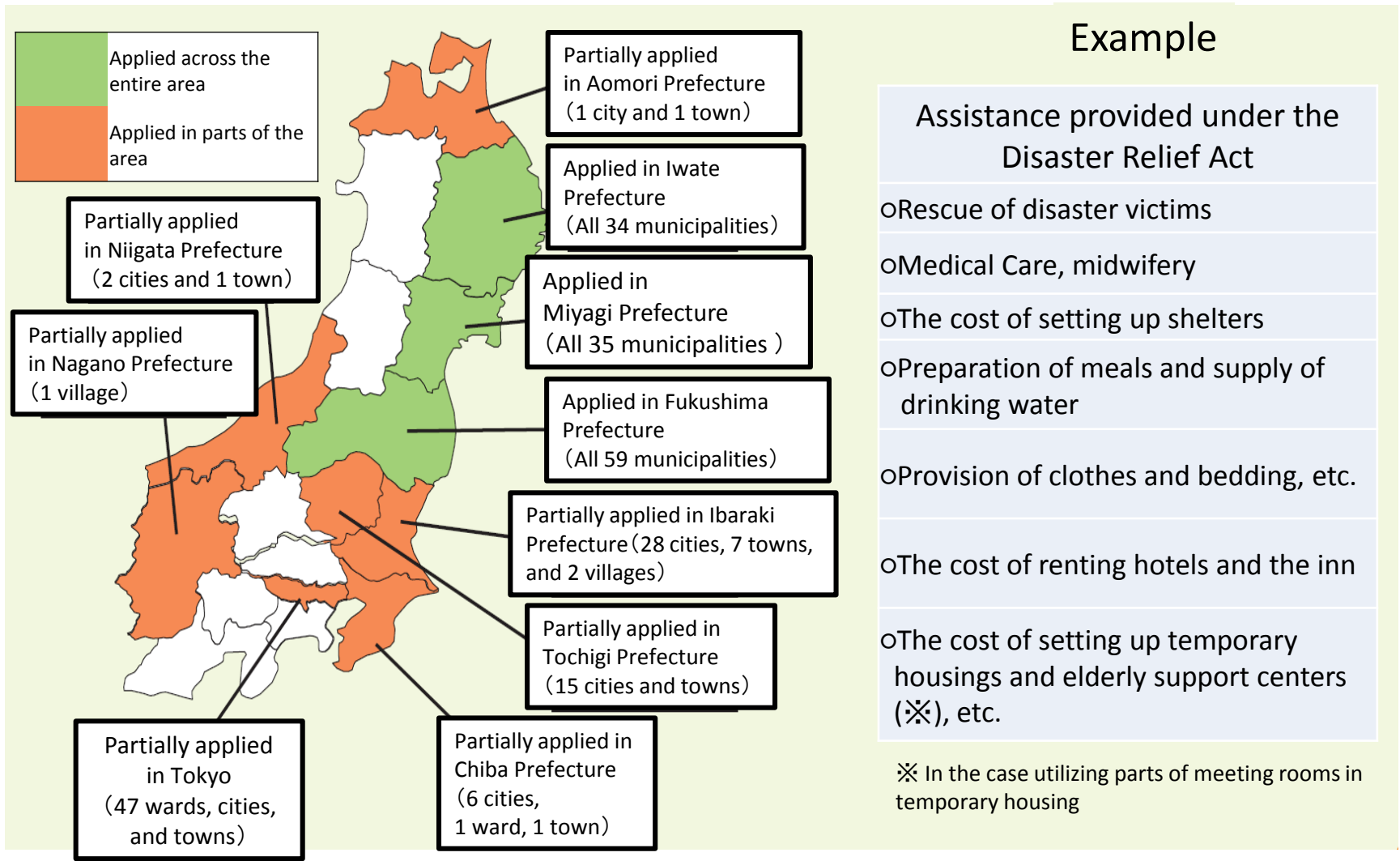


Application of the Disaster Relief Act

- Assistance provided under the Disaster Relief Act
- Rescue of disaster victims
 - Medical Care, midwifery
 - The cost of setting up shelters
 - Preparation of meals and supply of drinking water
 - Provision of clothes and bedding, etc.
 - The cost of renting hotels and the inn
 - The cost of setting up temporary housings and elderly support centers (※), etc.

※ In the case utilizing parts of meeting rooms in temporary housing
